

## **Youth Ministry Certification School (YMCS) at LTSG Course Titles and Reading List Overview**

YMCS is a 14 day course that offers the congregational youth leader a fairly comprehensive look at youth ministry from a theoretical, theological and practical viewpoint, under the leadership of seminary faculty, staff, pastors and youth ministry practitioners. The course list that follows represents the recent course titles offered during the course, and the instructor. *(There is no guarantee that the titles or instructors will be identical from year to year, but are likely to be similar)*

We have offered a week-long outdoor ed segment at an outdoor ministry site to some classes, but have shortened that in recent years.

Students must complete and present to their peers and course leadership, a plan for implementing youth ministry in their congregational setting in order to be certified. Plan presentations comprise a bulk of the final weekend of the course. Coaches for the course assist students with this process throughout the course.

The course reading list has expanded and adapted over the years, but the most recent reading list is also listed below. In recent years we have also begun to do a “book review” discussion with students once during each weekend segment, asking them to respond to their reading of recommended course readings.
