- **Begin timely conversion of a costly, failing steam system to geothermal**
- **Make the chapel safer and more accessible for all**
- **Preserve the chapel's valuable musical instruments**

Built in 1942, the Church of the Abiding Presence serves Gettysburg Seminary as its premier classroom and its largest venue for worship, public lectures, concerts and gathering spaces. It supports daily worship and the education of tomorrow's preachers.

Preservation: The current century-old central steam system is beyond its expected life-cycle. Converting it to geothermal technology will save 25-30% annually beginning the first year it is installed. That savings can translate into stronger support for our students. Moreover, the new heating and cooling technology will prevent deterioration of the organ, piano and harpsichord by stabilizing humidity levels in the chapel.

Accessibility, Safety and Comfort: Renovations including a ramp, elevator, and ADA compliant main entrances and restrooms will make it safer and easier to enter and enjoy the Chapel for any persons with physical challenges.

How Can You Get Involved? Sponsor a geothermal well (\$5000) or a pew or sections of pews (pews are \$2000 - \$3000)! These may be sponsored by individuals, congregations or groups of congregations.


